Noah's Ark Lodge No:347 - Over 200 years old and finally moving with the times

Noah's Ark Lodge number 347 was

consecrated in 1815 and is the second oldest lodge in the Province. Within the lodge there is a plethora of masonic history, knowledge and experience but until recent times we have struggled to bring ourselves into the modern world and have an online presence despite previous attempts.

In 2021 it was decided amongst the brethren that once and for all, Noah's Ark Lodge was going to launch a website and bring

themselves into the 21st century. Worshipful Brothers Rod Hall and Tom Booth agreed to take up the mantle and ensure the task was completed to a standard befitting of such a well-respected lodge.

After many hours spent viewing other lodge websites for inspiration, we put all our ideas together and spoke with the Dynamize Group to help us. We explained to them that we wanted to capture all things Noah's Ark including both the old and the new; particularly because in 2013 we left our old home at The Royal Oak, Dudley Port to move to our current home at The Masonic Hall, Edward Street, West Bromwich, and we wanted to pay homage to each.

The team at Dynamize went above and beyond to encompass everything Noah's Ark, including adding some very modern artistic photographs along with some of our old lodge room and delivered a first-class service and a modern website; when seeking approval to launch the site, the Provincial Webmaster, Worshipful Brother Chris Priestly commented:

"you have done a great job... clean, straight forward and stylish, with some nice pictures too, well done."

How to get your Lodge on line!

The Province of Staffordshire has almost 100 Lodges, and each one is different. These variations should be recognised, welcomed and promoted to individuals outside the Lodge who may be interested in joining the fraternity.

In either case once your web site or Lodge Profile is completed it can be linked to your Lodges name on the roll of Staffordshire Lodges on the Provincial website, thereby giving you an outward facing opportunity to impact on anyone who wishes to become member.

There is a "What If" document within the Provincial Vault that can help "You to engage with the public" and to generate a website and a "Guide to cheap and free emails" for use by your Lodge.

WILSON KEYS COURT is a Masonic built and run Scheme situated in Deanery Close, Rugeley only a few yards from Rugeley town centre.

This attractive building, set in mature landscaped gardens, provides 34 one-bedroom flats for applicants over the age of 60, who want to live independently with some support. Applicants over 55 and registered disabled would be considered if our scheme would enable continued independence.

Flats have alarm pull cords, providing assistance in an emergency, which are linked to the on-site Manager Monday to Friday 9am to 5 pm and connected to an emergency control

centre out of hours. Giving residents and families peace of mind.

Our indoor and outdoor social spaces provide opportunities for varied social activities.

Wilson Keys Memorial Fund

In 1974 the Harry Wilson Keys Memorial Fund was set up by the then Provincial Grand Master R. W. Bro. James E. V. Tonev as a fitting memorial to his predecessor R. W. Bro. Major Harry Wilson Keys. The object of the fund was to provide care for able, aged Freemasons and their dependents together with other members of the community surrounding Rugeley and in the County. The particular aim was to provide suitable accommodation where they could spend their later years. A freehold site was eventually purchased in Rugeley by the Trustees of the fund. Funding came from the Trustees, Mark Master Masons in Staffordshire, the Masonic Housing Association, the Grand Charity, (now the Masonic Charitable Foundation). An application to the Housing Corporation eventually produced sufficient funding for the project to become reality. The land was leased to the Masonic Housing Association for 125 years at a peppercorn rent.

Ashmole 8405 celebrates W. Bro. Dr E. N. Browns' 50 years in Masonry

Ashmole Lodge No. 8405 were delighted to receive the Provincial Grand Master, R. W. Bro John Lockley on Friday 20th January.

After refusing the Gavel offered by the WM W. Bro Clive Andrews-Lewis, the Provincial Grand Master settled down to a Past Masters Night and an excellent 3rd Degree Ceremony, after which the PGM asked W. Bro. Dr. E. N. Brown to join him for an informal chat about his life, his work and Masonic Careers.

Ever the raconteur, Dr. Brown was able to hold the temples' rapt attention while he described his history and the path that took him to become one of the leading experts in the subject of Dyslexia in Education, the founding of Maple Hayes School - and it's future under his Sons' Headmastership.

Neville is married to Brenda, his wife of many years. They have two sons. Neville and Brenda bought Maple Hayes Hall and turned it into a school for dyslexia sufferers. He is a world expert on dyslexia. His son W. Bro. Daryl, is now the head teacher there. Daryl is currently our DC. Neville is currently Ashmole's organist, and is a superb musician. Apparently he once had a jazz band.

Although Dr Brown is beyond usual retirement age, he is still principal of the school and its related charity, The Foundation for the Education of the Underachieving and Dyslexic. His dedication was marked last year with the Lifetime Achievement Award from the British Dyslexia Association. In 2008 Dr Brown was voted ITV's Midlands Teacher of the Year at the Pride of Britain Awards.

Neville also has the distinction of owning a deer park, adjacent to the hall. Whenever there is a function there, venison is always on the menu.



Trent Lodge Centenary

The Trent Lodge No. 4269 was duly consecrated at the Kings Hall, Stoke on Trent on Monday 25th April 1921 at 3.30pm by W Bro George C Kent PAGDC DPGM acting as Grand Master assisted by and supported by 150 brethren which included the founders.

The founders had chosen a name "Trent" which would commend itself to every Freemason not only in the province of Staffordshire but in adjoining provinces through which ran the famous river.

W Bro Kent said "... he believed the lodge be like the river from whence it took its name, beginning in a small way but gradually enlarging itself, until, like the river, it becomes Great in the History of Freemasonry"

On Monday, 21st November 2022, slightly later than planned due to the dreaded pandemic, the current Brethren of Trent Lodge were able to celebrate the 100th Birthday of the Lodge and were joined by some 116 brethren including the Provincial Grand Master of Staffordshire, a full delegation of Provincial Grand Lodge of Staffordshire, a contingent from the Provincial Grand Chapter of Staffordshire accompanied by the Grand Superintendent and many brethren from lodges across the province and other provinces across the country.



From the initial entry into the temple and seeing two rows of Grand Lodge seats at the top, three rows of seats for the brethren down the North and the South side and taking in the sheer quantity in attendance, the evening got better and better, not one but two processions into the lodge by the Provincial Team - something normally only reserved for Provincial Grand Lodge at Stafford and I believe the first time ever performed in a Private Lodge.





The delegation of Royal Arch chapter led by the Grand Superintendent was part of those processions, again a first in a Private Lodge. The Provincial Grand Master and the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies really put on a show for us, interlaced with special moments of applause and humour throughout the night.

W. Bro Andy Edwards P.Pr.J.G.W. of Trent Lodge, gave a thoroughly enjoyable and well researched brief history of the lodge taking us on a winding and informative journey from our Consecration up to the Present Day, it was a pleasure to listen to and absorb everything he was telling us together with the stories of old.

The Lodge now have another Warrant for the Centenary which will be duly framed and stand proud each night we meet as a reminder of the milestone that the lodge has reached and not just reached but crossed with a team of Light Blues in waiting that will take us formidably into the next decade and beyond! All of the Past Masters of the lodge and I'm certain each brother too was so proud of the ceremony and celebration that we managed to produce together, it was a real team effort and one worthy of praise for everybody.

A fantastic and truly memorable evening was had by all that attended and over £1100 was raised for charity and a cheque for £4269 was presented to the Provincial Grand Master for the 2024 Festival. Also, a personalised 8" plate was given to each brother in attendance to commemorate the evening.





In doing so he gave especial thanks to the outgoing Deputy Grand Superintendent, Excellent Companion Eddie Ford for his many years of service to Masonry in general, but to the Royal Arch in Staffordshire in particular. Eddie will no doubt be of great support to the new executive even after the new officers are appointed at the AGM in May 2023.

Below is a short biography of the new officers.

Deputy Grand Superintendent designate - Excellent Companion Ralph Howarth

Ralph became a Freemason in 2005 and was initiated into Chartley Lodge No 7569 becoming Worshipful Master in 2012 and again in 2017. Ralph is now a member of Legge Lodge No 2784 and is its ADC.

He was Exalted into Izaak Walton Chapter No.4281 in 2006 and became MEZ in 2013 and again in 2020, he is still the Chapter's First Principal. Ralph is also a member of Burslem Chapter No. 98 and is the current Scribe E.

He received his first Provincial appointment in 2015, being appointed as a Provincial Grand Steward.

In 2017 Ralph was appointed as Provincial Grand Almoner in both Craft and Royal Arch and introduced the MCF Visiting Volunteer scheme to the Province. He remains a member of the team and has assisted numerous Brethren and their families.

In 2020 he was promoted to Third Provincial Grand Principal and in 2021 became Second Provincial Grand Principal. He works with the Chapter Support Group, as well as his other duties on the Provincial Executive. During the pandemic Ralph worked on the membership support fund, with W Bro David Phillips and W Bro Tony Coates PGA, helping Brethren maintain their memberships despite being in difficult circumstances brought on by Covid 19.

In 2022 he was honoured by Grand Lodge and Supreme Grand Chapter and was appointed as Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies and Past Grand Standard Bearer respectively, a rare double honour.

Ralph is a member of the Foster Gough Lodge No 2706 and is the current Junior



Warden and is a member of Staffordshire First Principal's Chapter No. 2706. In other Orders he is a member of Knights Templar, Knight Templar Priests, Rose Croix and the Red Cross of Constantine orders and has served on the KT Provincial Prior's Bodyguard for over 10 years.

Ralph is happily married to Julie and has two children, Niall aged 25 who is an aerospace technician and Niamh aged 21 who has just finished her degree studies in clinical psychology at Lincoln University.

Initiated into St Michaels Lodge in 2003, Paul became a Steward and then Lodge Treasurer for several years before progressing though the Wardens' chairs and becoming Worshipful Master. Paul was exalted two years later into Eccleshall Chapter in 2005 and is one of the first Masons in Staffordshire to go through the three Principals' chairs before becoming Worshipful Master of his own Lodge in 2013.

In Craft he is also in the Provincial Grand Stewards Lodge, having been made a Provincial Grand Steward and then subsequently promoted to his current rank of Past Senior Grand Deacon.

In Royal Arch, Paul is also a member of Staffordshire First Principals Chapter. Having been Provincial Grand Standard Bearer and then Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies, Paul is currently 3rd Provincial Grand Principal.

Paul is also a member of Knights Templar and Rose Croix Orders and is currently Deputy Commander of the Provincial Prior's Bodyguard in KT.

Outside of freemasonry Paul enjoys watching and coaching rugby union and is a keen supporter, player, and coach of Eccleshall RUFC for over 30 years. Despite the weather, almost 50 Brothers turned up to a cold Wolverhampton morning, some travelling for many hours from London, Dorset, Hertfordshire, Bristol, Derbyshire, Shropshire, Warwickshire, and Cheshire, to name a few.



Notwithstanding the cold and the distance involved, brethren were able to witness the first ceremony to be performed by the Lodge officers – the previous two meetings having been the consecration of the Lodge followed by the Banner dedication.

Brother Mark Tarpey was the guest of honour

as the candidate and was accompanied by seven other members from the North Staffs Round Table Lodge to witness the event. Despite the differences in ritual and local traditions experienced by the members of the Science Fiction and Fantasy Lodge, from their various Provinces, the ceremony was performed well, and included a faultless presentation of the extended version of the 2nd Degree Tracing Board by w Bro Jon Rees. We once again demonstrated some of the slight "modifications" to normal Lodge equipment: the Master and his Wardens use



'Thor's hammers' (otherwise known as a Mjolnir) instead of gavels; the Deacons use Light Sabers instead of wands; the DC and the ADC use Gandalf wands and the Tyler has a fearsome looking Klingon Bat'leth rather than a sword. In addition, the IPM has a pin attached to his collar representing the King's Hand, made famous in the television series Game of Thrones. There's even a ballot box in the form of a Tardis!

The members of the Lodge process into the room in darkness, accompanied by appropriate music which builds up the atmosphere, and the procession out is formed up and accompanied by music which ensures the Brethren are ready for a lively and original Festive Board!

Once the meeting and ceremony is completed in the traditional manner and kept truthful to the emulation ritual, the Festive Board is where members engender entertaining elements. The Lodge has many traditions for such a young age! The wine taking

W Bro Jeremy Roberts, in conjunction with the Deputy Grand Master's Escort, W Bro Peter Clarke.




Foster Gough Lodge No 2706 125th Anniversary Special Lodge Meeting
