detailing the fund raising and details of a letter from Lynne Stone, Vice Chair, Corporate Fund Raiser from the Blood Bikes thanking the Province, seventy-six freemasons with friends, family and Blood Bike representatives descended on Brocton Golf Club near Stafford on Sunday 11th February

This was to see the Provincial Grand Master R.W. Bro John Lockley formally hand over a brand-new motorcycle named 'Staffordshire Freemasons' to Lynne. Also present to see the handover was the UGLE Deputy Grand Master, Sir David Hugh Wootton and the Lord Lieutenant of Staffordshire Ian Dudson CBF.

The £15,500 needed to buy the bike was raised with donations of £4,000 from the Staffordshire Grand Stewards Lodge, £300 from Gordon Lodge, £500 from Staffordshire Masonic Clay Shooting Club and the final £10,700 from Provincial funds authorised by the PGM.







Ceramic Lodge No. 3287 celebrate with W. Bro. Philip Plant.

On Saturday 18th November 2023,

W Bro Philip Plant PPr SGW of Ceramic Lodge No 3827 celebrated 60 years in Freemasonry and was joined at Hanley Masonic Hall by both Freemasons and close family members.

The lodge was "Called Off" to allow his family and personal guests to be present in the lodge room where the RW Provincial Grand Master, W Bro John Lockley conducted a Questions and Answers session with W Bro Philip that covered his early life, schooling, military service in the Seaforth Highlanders, an extensive career in the Pottery and Ceramics industry, and family life with his late wife Anne.

Worshipful Brother Philip Plant was born on Tuesday 27th July 1937 in Eccleshall, Staffordshire, to Major James and Edna Plant, his father was a member of Eccleshall Lodge No. 5389.

Philip was educated locally but later attended Gordonstoun School, Morayshire, Scotland, where he met the future King, Prince Charles. Further schooling took place at Schule Schloss Salem School in Germany under tutelage of Kurt Hahn.

He attended North Staffordshire Technical

College obtaining a diploma in Ceramics and a 1st Class Managers Certificate. He also gained a British Pottery Manufacturers Federation silver medal in pottery and bronze medal refractories.

Philip completed his military service with the 1st Battalion, the Seaforth Highlanders and served in Norway as a winter warfare expert and then in Gibraltar. He was active during both the Suez crisis and during the cold war when he

was based in Germany.

Following his time in the Forces, he resumed his career in senior management and directorships of several potteries including Spode, Royal Winton, Royal Albert, and senior management posts with the Wedgwood Group.

He married Anne in 1963 and has a daughter Penny and a son Robert and has seven grandchildren.

Philip was initiated into Ceramic Lodge No. 3827 on Saturday 16th November 1963 at the age of 26. During his 60 years in freemasonry, he has undertaken several offices and was Worshipful Master in 1981. Philip continues to provide support and guidance within the lodge and regularly attends Lodge of Instruction as Preceptor.

The certificate was presented to Philip by the PGM who congratulated and thanked Philip for his long service to freemasonry. After a wonderful meeting a 'white table' event was held including an auction of a book produced by Philip and his late wife on fine ceramic ware raised a substantial amount for the festival.

Archway: A new resource for Royal Arch Chapters, is now live.

Archway is designed for Royal Arch Chapters to help shape their future, grow their membership, and enhance their member's experience. It is based on extensive research of what members want—and what works well in successful, thriving Chapters across our Constitution. Many of the challenges that Chapters face are different to Lodges. Archway is therefore not a simple translation of the Members' Pathway into the Royal Arch, and so has been developed separately. However, some of the challenges are similar.

Each of the four named stones of the arch are interactive and clicking on it takes you to a new page containing useful tools to help you fully understand your Chapter.

- "Shape"- shows you how to capture your Chapter's strengths, areas for improvement, a skills base, and a succession and development plan.
- **"Grow"** informs and advises you about creating a positive environment, empowering your members, maintaining contact with those who have left, or don't attend meetings regularly and how to best promote your Chapter.
- "Involve" this is the engagement section. It helps you to promote and understand how to bring our ritual within the reach of all members, how to

- encourage and support and more importunately develop officers and members ready for the future.
- "Enjoy" you always hear us say 'enjoy your Royal Arch Masonry'. We can only do that by understanding what our members want, structuring our meetings well, promoting visiting and being inclusive. This section can show you how best to achieve those aims.

Archway aims to help Chapters become more vibrant and more enjoyable, so that every Companion looks forward to their next meeting with enthusiasm. Resources to enhance understanding of the Royal Arch are also provided along with advice for attracting new members, and for supporting every member of the Chapter.

The single point of contact for Archway in Staffordshire is E Comp Ralph Howarth, our Deputy Grand Superintendent, who is more than happy to answer any queries that you may have on Archway. We hope that you will use this superb tool in helping the Royal Arch in Staffordshire, and especially your own Chapter, prosper for the future.

Scott is a member, also a large delegation from Ethlefleda Lodge 6600, their Daughter Lodge and to which W. Bro Scott is a frequent visitor. The Deputy Provincial Grand Master, V. W. Bro. D.J. Thomas presided on the evening and was ably assisted by W.Bro. K. Gibbons, the Pr.A.G.D.C.

Following the presentation of two Grand Lodge Certificates to members, the DPGM invited Bro. Scott to join him on the Lodge floor and then conducted a very interesting informal discussion with him about his life and Masonic career.

V.W.Bro. Thomas opened the discussion by informing the Brethren that 'two Chartered Accountants were going to have a conversation and that they would try to keep everyone awake!' W. Bro. Stuart openly chatted in his usual warm and charming way about his family, his work life in accountancy and his Masonic career and achievements.

Bro. Stuart (as he is known to everyone) was initiated into Marmion Lodge in December 1973, passed in March 1974, and raised the following month. He was Junior Warden in 1983, Senior Warden in 1984, and Worshipful Master for the first time in 1985. Bro Stuart is not only a member Marmion Chapter 1060, but also many other orders in Freemasonry.

In the Province he was first appointed Pr.D.G.D.C. in 1989 but he has received many promotions following this and in 2017 was promoted to Past Provincial Senior Grand Warden. He is also Provincial Grand Treasurer for the Provincial Grand Chapter of Staffordshire.

Bro. Stuart has just completed three years

One interesting fact emerged was that the Provincial Grand Master had only recently celebrated a 60-year presentation with a brother who had been initiated in a lodge meeting in Southern Africa in the Scottish Constitution and was now a Staffordshire Freemason.

Marcus on his achievement of 60-years in Freemasonry, described such long serving brethren as being the backbone of freemasonry and an inspiration to others. The PGM subsequently promoted Bro. Outside of Masonry John and his wife Georgie have long been involved with the Wolverhampton branch of the Samaritans. Georgie was a director there for many years and is still very much involved and John was secretary He was also a clerk of works when the centre was upgraded and improved and installed and maintains the Centre's computer network from home





John is a Lewis, his father W. Bro Les Savage initiated, passed, and raised him into Sandwell Lodge No. 4673 in 1974. John carried out all the various offices of the Lodge and eventually became Worshipful Master in 1985. His father Les also Exalted John into Dartmouth Royal Arch Chapter No. 662 in December 1976, where he carried out various offices and was MEZ in 1985. Apart from a break to be MEZ John was Scribe E for a total of 39 years until he took over as Treasurer in 2022. He was also the Secretary during the merger of the two lodges to form Walton Walker & Sandwell Lodge No.3847 in June 2009 and continued in that office for 3 years until he became Treasurer in 2012, a post he still holds.

When Edward Street Masonic Hall was initially improved after many years of neglect John was one of the three young masons who took on the job of House Committee for the West Bromwich Masonic Hall Company. This was the beginning of

the long way forward to bring this building up to the standard you see today. He was a Director until November 1994 and Secretary of the Masonic Hall Company for over 20 years until April 2009 and even to this day his advice is still sought by the Directors

Wulfrun Lodge No. 4602 Centenary on Monday 5th February 2024.

On the cold foggy afternoon of Friday December 28th 1923, 19 Founders gathered together at the then, new Masonic Hall, 62 Darlington Street, Wolverhampton, to take part in the Consecration of the 50th Staffordshire Lodge.



A total of 87 attended the meeting including the Deputy PGM, W.Bro. George Kent, Presiding Officer. The Master Designate, W.Bro. Willcock, PM. of St. Peter's Lodge No. 419, was Installed by W.Bro. T. Lowe, Provincial Grand Secretary and Founding Member of Wulfrun Lodge.

The City of Wolverhampton was named after Lady Wulfrun who features at the centre of the Wulfrun Lodge Banner, designed by W.Bro. Beck, Founder, and presented to the Lodge in 1927. The Banner was refurbished in 2000. The first Regular meeting was held on

Monday February 4th 1924 when Bro. Alfred Mould became the first joining member.

Perhaps the most famous member of Wulfrun Lodge was Sir Arthur Bagnall, initiated in 1946 by his father Brookes Bagnall. Sir Arthur produced the Bagnall Report on Masonic Charities, adopted by UGLE in 1973 which recommended the merger of the Masonic Girls and Boys Schools and later the creation of the

Grand Charity, all now under the umbrella of the Masonic Charitable Foundation.
