young child, especially in an emergency situation. Teddies

for Loving Care (TLC) is a way of providing much-needed comfort to children in A&E departments, helping to reduce the shock and distress of their experience.

Every child that receives a teddy gets to take it home and since its inception in 2001, some 3.5 million teddies have been distributed to hospitals throughout England and Wales.

Teddies have gone to the A&E department at the Royal Stoke University Hospital and will also be used in Ambulances.

50th Anniversary celebration at the Lodge of Honour No. 525

The Lodge of Honour No. 525 meeting at The Firs, Codsall, Wolverhampton on the evening of Friday 13th December 2024, was quite special, for W. Bro Robin. G. Brindley PPrJGW their senior Past Master who was celebrating his 50th anniversary in Freemasonry. The Lodge were pleased to receive the Deputy Provincial Grand Master VW Bro David J. Thomas accompanied by a Director of Ceremonies and several Provincial officers to celebrate with W. Bro Robin.

W. Bro Raymond. J. Haynes PJGD was invited and took the opportunity to say a few words to Robin and the brethren. He stated how honoured he felt to celebrate and pay tribute to his friend and brother, who he had first met when he was at initiated in January 1979.

He continued and commented how Robin was initiated into the Lodge exactly 50 years ago on Friday 13th December 1974, having been proposed by his father, Bro Bill Brindley. But there was a strong family connection to the Lodge as Bro Stanley Brindley, his uncle, a wellknown and respected Wolverhampton Solicitor was also a member.

Robin progressed through the offices of the Lodge and became W. Master in 1986, installing his successor W. Bro Haynes in an exemplary manner the following year. Whilst Robin did not join any other Lodges or Orders, he continues to be a very active and a devoted member regularly attending the Lodge. Describing Robin as an excellent ritualist and having a quiet and reserved disposition with a very caring attitude.

Robin grew up in Codsall at a time when it was a small rural village, his father had started a garage in a small wooden shed on Birches Bridge in 1931 selling petrol and repairing cars. The business soon grew but was put on hold



by WWII. However, when Robin's father Bill, a Colonel in the Army was 'demobbed' the business resumed and in due course Robin, having gained his qualifications joined the Company in 1963, becoming the Managing Director in 1970.

Robin now resides in Bridgnorth with his beloved wife Jo and has a stepson Che, the company has expanded considerably over time and W. Brindley Garages Ltd has several outlets and dealerships employing over 300 people. After 60 years with the Company Robin retired in 2024, and he is now enjoying his retirement having passed responsibility to Che.

W. Bro Haynes congratulated Robin and the certificate commemorating his achievement was read to the Lodge by the Director of

Ceremonies before being presented to Robin by the DPGM. The DPGM also, thanked Robin for his dedication and duly promoted him to PPrSGW, presenting him with the badge and jewel of the office. St Modwens 4850 hold 50th Anniversary celebration

On Tuesday 26th November St Modwen's Lodge No: 4850 who meet at Burton upon

Trent were pleased to receive the Deputy Provincial Grand Master VW Bro David J. Thomas accompanied by a Director of Ceremonies and several Provincial officers. The meeting was of particular significance as W. Bro. Ian Mc Glynn was celebrating 50 years in Freemasonry

Ian was born in Liverpool but from the age of two he was raised in Carshalton, Surrey and as a teenager he attended Sutton County Grammar School. Ian liked music, especially rock music, so much so with his band he would play at local pubs and village halls and occasionally as a 'warm up' for artists such as John Mayall OBE and Graham Bond, both well-known blues and rock musicians and song writers, also the rock band 'The Herd' fronted by Peter Frampton.

Ian would have liked the trappings of the 'Rock and Roll lifestyle' of the 1960's, however, realising he could be no match for the likes of Eric Clapton or George Harrison, he decided on a Civil Engineering Course at Southampton University where he met his wife to be.

After University, whilst Ian took his first job with Greater London Council Dept. of Public Health Engineering, later to become Thames Water, his future wife moved to Australia to continue her education. She returned in the early 1970's and they were married in 1976. Ian later gained employment with Severn Trent Water, and they settled in Burton upon Trent to raise their young son and daughter.

In 1974 Ian had been initiated into Holborn Bars Lodge No: 5675 in London by his father who at the time was W. Master, Ian progressed through the offices and became W. Master in 1983 but by this time having a young family and difficulty travelling such a long distance, he became a country member.

In 1994 Ian joined St Modwen's Lodge and became W. Master in 2003 and then again twenty years later in 2023. But, in 2007 Ian had returned to full membership of his London Lodge becoming their W. Master again in 2009, then their Secretary until 2018, he received London Grand Rank in 2011. After his retirement, Ian became self-employed as a water industry consultant alternating this with his work as a yachting instructor, which remains his great passion. Ian enjoys his sailing and work with the Nancy Becket Trust, a charity for maintaining a historical sailing boat for the development of young people, of which he is a Trustee. Ian now splits his time between this, Freemasonry and four grandchildren.

Gnosall St Lawrence 50th

Gnosall St. Lawrence Lodge No: 9458 meet at Rugeley & District Masonic Centre, (Chase Golf Club) in Penkridge and Wednesday 13th November was a special meeting, for them and one of their founders, the current Lodge Secretary, W. Bro Christopher Roger Boston PPrJGW. The Deputy Provincial Grand Master VW Bro David J. Thomas attended the meeting, accompanied by a Director of Ceremonies and Provincial officers in order to celebrate the evening with W. Bro Chris.

Chris was a 'War baby', born in Birmingham in 1943, he completed his education and became an accountant, later working at the renowned suppliers of Masonic Regalia, Light and Boston. He met his wife Barbara and in September 1969 they were married and were blessed with two sons Stuart and Andrew. They moved to Pelsall, where they raised their family and later moved to Church Eaton, Staffordshire. Both Stuart and Andrew went on to university, they both married, and Chris and Barbara were overjoyed to have two grandchildren, Theodore and Imogen. Eventually in 2017 Barbara and Chris had the house to themselves, but sadly Barbara fell ill and passed away the follo



fell ill and passed away the following year.

Chris was supported by his family, friends and neighbours and only recently moved to a smaller property. He keeps himself busy and continues to enjoy his Freemasonry, having been initiated into Aston Old Edwardians Lodge No: 3857, a Warwickshire Lodge in October 1974, shortly after the birth of his children. Over the next decade Chris joined other Orders, he is active in Secret Monitor, Mark Master Masons and the Holy Royal Arch, holding Provincial rank in each.

> But it was in 1992 that Chris became a founder member of Gnosall St. Lawrence Lodge, holding many offices over time and became their W. Master in 1998, 2013, 2014 and then again in 2017. However, Chris is most well-known for his involvement in the demonstration team of the Sutton Coldfield Study Circle, which enacts the Ancient Lodge workings of 1765, and he was their President twice. The team has performed not only around the Midlands but in various provinces around the country, also in Palma, Mallorca and Hamburg, Germany. The Team have raised more than £500k for various charities over the years.

It doesn't change anything about the underlying Royal Arch story or the message it imparts but allows the Companions and the candidate to appreciate the candidate's involvement and his reaction, because the story is easier to follow. It is a shorter, efficient and a more engaging experience and this is why it has become quite popular.

The most significant difference is that in other rituals the narrative and the performance aspect are split, which means the story essentially gets run twice, whereas this version has simultaneous acting and narration. This means there is less coming and going and it creates more roles for other participants.

It's shorter and more fun to participate in, but without losing any of the gravitas of the ceremony and its underlying story and it is hoped that this keeps the character of the story and that it is still clearly recognisable to anyone in the Royal Arch but is a little more engaging.

So, what is the Savage Ritual?

The Savage Club Chapter Ritual was rediscovered in the archive of the Savage Club Chapter No 2190, who meet in London, in the mid-2000s, and had seemingly been approved for use many decades previously but had never been brought into use. After members of the chapter read it, the consensus was that
