Widows Sons at the Ride to the Wall


Members of various UK Chapters of the Widows Sons Masonic Bikers Association gathered at

The Master was pleased to have those extracted Minutes signed by 11 of the Founders present for these celebrations as a true and correct record of what there and then took place.

Festivals over the years; how the Lodge conducts its usual business with numerous Masonic and non-Masonic speakers and presentations for the interest of the Brethren and visitors alike; a brief insight into how Bro Andrew Dineley felt when the Lodge conducted his Ceremony of Passing, a unique occasion for the Lodge who do not ordinarily conduct Ceremonies; and, finally, a presentation to the Lodge by the Provincial Grand Master, R. W. Bro John Lockley, the Lodge Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies, extolling the virtues of the Lodge, it's establishment in the Province and culminating in conferring an in-field promotion on R. W. Bro Stephen Varley, Provincial Grand Master of Derbyshire, to Past Provincial Senior Grand Warden.

The Lodge was closed and a short interlude in proceedings took place whilst the Lodge Room was set up for Lodge Glittering Star No 322 (Irish Constitution) who had been invited to share the birthday celebrations and provide an exemplification of a First Degree Ceremony. At the end of the proceedings, the Festive Board was filled with laughter and good humour. The selected menu was taken from the original Consecration Menu with a gift of a firing Toby to all those who attended. The Alms collection was in excess of £400 and shared with Lodge Glittering Star and the raffle, which included silver plated cuff links supplied by Lodge Glittering Star, raised in excess of £350

PTSD Progress through Diving

A few months ago I noticed an advert on Facebook regarding a charity namely 'PTSD Progress through Diving' by W. Bro Kevin James of Yuma Lodge within the District Grand Lodge of The Bahamas and Turks.

I was initially trying to find a suitable brother to benefit from his help but after speaking to him over a number of months Kevin picked up on my own struggles with PTSD and he offered to research and source flights and invited me to Long Island, The Bahamas.

I must admit I was sceptical at first but a few months later Kevin was back in touch and true to his word, he had arranged a very kind gift of economy flights out and first class back. All I had to do was pick the dates! Well, September came around and I was off, I was feeling a little anxious about the long flight, going to a new country and meeting new people, but I needn't have worried. From the moment I arrived I was able to feel that strong Masonic connection that seems to bring the District of The Bahamas and Turks closer. I was taken by a Brother on a short tour of Nassau before then taking the short flight to Long Island where the strong Masonic support continued and I was met by Kevin at the airport. I was most warmly welcomed and we went on to visit the newly consecrated Long Island lodge building.

I later joined in the rehearsal for a forthcoming initiation, assisting in various offices as well as performing the Working Tools and I was then most honoured

to be involved in the ceremony of Initiation of Bro Macgyver Coakley-Wells. During the evening I sat with and spoke to Kevin, also the District Grand Master R.W. Bro Robert Deal Jr and other Brethren, listening to how the recent hurricane, Dorian had seriously affected the Island. I was so proud to be a Freemason and hear how Freemasonry had helped.

I was so impressed at the excitement and pride that Macgyver had showed in becoming a Freemason both on the evening and during my stay that I was able to foster a strong friendship with him and I will be following his progress with keen interest. I, like many other veterans miss the banter and comradeship during my military service, so having this common ground with Kevin was a real benefit. Diving has had such a positive effect on my PTSD symptoms as you need to place your trust in your buddy and this was made so very easy with Kevin. The 14 dives we had together were remarkable; each one was exhilarating and helped reduce my symptoms.

I would also like to mention the amazing Masonic experience The Bahamas has offered me. It would be easy to say that the diving was the main factor in making me feel this way, but that would sell short how amazing both Kevin and his partner Audrey have been in supporting me together with every single one of the Brethren.

When I was due to return to the UK Kevin kindly accompanied me back to Nassau where yet again we were met at the airport by another Brother who collected us and took us to his home where we were kindly accommodated for the night and enjoyed his company over pizzas and a cool beer.

The District of the Bahamas and Turks will have a lasting place in my heart and see my visit as a life changing experience both from a Masonic point of view and with the Diving which will remain a positive milestone in my life and my mental health. Remember, "There are no strangers in Freemasonry, only friends you've yet to meet". I remain truly humbled by the generosity and kindness given to me by all and I hope more Freemason's can benefit from W. Bro Kevin James's passion for helping those who are struggling with their mental health.




Well the dream became a reality after a dispensation was obtained, some 40 members and guests from several Lodges

The event began with a warm welcome and introduction by Bro Bob Reay, Chairman of the Light Blue Club, followed by R.W. Bro David V. Hagger Provincial Grand Master and V.W. Bro Peter C. Kinder Deputy Provincial Grand Master and President of the Light Blue Club.

The morning continued with Freemasonry for Women with speakers from The Honourable Fraternity of Ancient Freemason (HFAF) Grand Master M.W. Bro Christine Chapman and The Order

of Women Freemasons (OWF) Deputy Grand Secretary W. Bro Elaine Malone.

There then followed three Breakout Sessions regarding NYMC by esteemed brethren and an address about Solomon by R. W. Bro David Pratt Provincial Grand Master of Yorkshire West Riding. The Grand Secretary and CEO V.W. Bro Dr David Staples then addressed the conference before the event was finally closed by Bro Bob Reay and W. Bro Mitchell Merrick-Thirlway, NYMC administrator.

Following the conference the brethren were invited to a meeting of Wyggeston Lodge No. 3448 where a Raising ceremony was performed and there followed a very enjoyable festive board.





The Universities Scheme Conference

The Universities Scheme Bi-annual Conference 2019 was this year hosted by the Province of Cheshire and held on Saturday 16thNovember at Cheshire View, Christleton, Chester with over 180 delegates from as far as Cornwall and Durham.

Following registration and refreshments the event began with a warm welcome and introduction, present were R. W. Bro Sir David Hugh Wootton AGM and President, R. W. Bro Stephen Blank PGM Cheshire and W. Bro Julian Soper Chairman of the scheme. Also present was R. W. Bro David K. Williamson Past AGM and Past President together with a number of distinguished guests.





Sir David Wootton set out the aims of the day whilst the Chairman, Julian Soper set out the ambitions and thanked the Province of Cheshire for hosting the event. W.Bro. Craig Johnson from the UGLE Learning and Development team on behalf of R.W. Bro Stuart Hadler P.PGM Somerset who had been taken ill, gave a very interesting presentation about the educational platform 'Solomon' and its benefits.

There followed a number of 'workshops' on various topics including valuable input by Staffordshire brethren including

V. W. Bro David Thomas DPGM, W. Bro's Andy Mapperson, Peter

Hughes, Nick Thomas, David Firth and Bro Mark Coates.

There were also interesting presentations on Freemasonry for Women, also on the work of N&YMC by Bro Jack Saunders and Michelle Worvell leading the Communications team from UGLE presented on use of social media

There was a lively Question and Answer session before the afternoon finally closed with a few comments by the President Sir David and the Chairman.





Provincial Away Day

The first Provincial Away Day was held at Tettenhall Road, Wolverhampton on Saturday 28th September 2019. The topics covered were numerous but linked by the common factor of Membership of this Province. The aim of the day was to draw in all the recent updates for initiatives stemming from United Grand Lodge and to provide those who attended with a precis of those initiatives. If you were unable to attend, this synopsis should assist in bringing you up to speed. There will be other similar days organised in the future and all members of the Province are encouraged to attend or at least send one representative from your Lodge / Chapter. A PDF copy of the complete PowerPoint presentation is available from the Provincial Membership Officer, W. Bro Ralph Ritchey, PPrJGW.

Proceedings were opened by the Provincial Grand Master, R. W. Bro John Lockley who thanked all the Brethren for attending and the presenters for their input to bring the Province up to date with the various initiatives cascading from UGLE.

W. Bro Ritchey gave a presentation on the new Vault website where members can find, in one location, all of the initiatives from UGLE and how these have been, where appropriate, adapted for the Province. The site mirrors the b.UGLE website and enables users to logon to identify and use the initiatives along with several useful links to supporting documents and websites. The content is not designed to be downloaded and filed but should be accessed and extracts used for the purposes required. On the homepage there is also a link to the Provincial Office administration website accessed by Lodge Secretaries and Chapter Scribe E's containing a further wealth of useful documents to ensure your Lodge / Chapter are kept up to date. Details of the Vault can be obtained through your lodge secretary.

W. Bro Paul Molley, ProvGSuptWrks gave a presentation on how part of the armoury to be used by Lodges / Chapters to attract new members, can be a website. This presentation was a hop skip and a jump across various facets of creating, hosting, and maintaining a web presence to attract



potential new members. All the details from the Provincial Communications Team is contained in the Provincial Vault and those who are considering the creation of a website are strongly advised to read all the information prior to and during the construction of that website. The same applies to Facebook and Twitter – and again there are set protocols from the Province to follow. UGLE also encourage you to adopt their protocols.

Bro Darren Walker followed and gave a presentation and discussion regarding creating a lodge profile for a website and how that could attract membership and will ensure a consistent message is created and can easily be referred to during the process of interviewing a potential Candidate. Examples of a Lodge Profile will be uploaded to the Provincial Vault shortly.

W. Bro Ritchey then took the Brethren on a journey through the various stages of the recently updated Membership Pathway, which is located in the Provincial Vault. The Brethren were given a clear demonstration of the process a potential member can expect. This would be primarily for someone not introduced to the Lodge directly by an existing member, but someone who has made enquiries via the UGLE website or elsewhere.

The presentation by W. Bro Matt Gibbons ProvGSec centred on new initiatives to be launched very soon by UGLE in the form of "Project Hermes". Membership data is currently being controlled under the Adelphi 2 system with limited access to the information contained in that database and regulated by a few in the Province. This information will be migrated to "Project Hermes" and allow a Lodge Secretary / Chapter Scribe E to have access to the information currently required for various forms and allow them to be completed directly online with both the Provincial Office and UGLE. This will involve amendments to the Book of Constitutions but is designed to save time and cost. A select number of Provinces have been given access to "Hermes" on a trial basis and a full roll-out of this is anticipated within 18 months. See the recent Grand Lodge Quarterly Communications for September 2019 for additional details.

W. Bro David Watt, PAGDC, ProvGMentor highlighted the important work of being a Lodge Mentor and the retention of members whilst W. Bro John Brackpool, PAGDC, ProvGDC offered advice and assistance from his team on "Protocol & Best Practice" and "traditions" within Lodges. There then followed a presentation by W. Bro John Skellern, ProvGChStwd who spoke about Masonic Charities and how collections are used by the Masonic Charitable Foundation on our behalf across the UK and within Staffordshire. He advised that not more than 18p in every £ donated is used for administration within the MCF, meaning more of your money is directed to the charitable causes. In 2018 that amounted to in excess of £48.1m! A new initiative focus for the MCF is on loneliness and more details on this initiative will be released by Freemasonry Today Magazine and the MCF website – links to which have also been created via the new Provincial Vault website.

A most enjoyable and interactive presentation by the Royal Arch Talking Heads team followed in a similar style to how this is provided within a Lodge Meeting. This lasts no more than 15 minutes and the presentation asks all the burning principal questions of a prospective candidate into the Royal Arch and explains them in a concise and interesting format that is both humorous as well as engaging.

W. Bro Molley returned to the floor and explained how like the other initiatives cascading from UGLE, Solomon is not a static resource designed to be downloaded to your laptop, tablet or phone. However, it is designed to be used on these platforms for individual structured learning; group discussions and use in the Lodge / Chapter either from the shorter nuggets of information or the slightly longer papers that can be further enhanced and made more interesting with the introduction of a PowerPoint slide show to supplement the words.

Ideas for the use of Solomon include during a Lodge / Chapter of Instruction or utilising an illustrated paper in a catechetical form to encourage more members to join in the delivery. New resources within Solomon include a further 100 articles recently added; the use of professional recordings for various nuggets and papers; and, in the future, video demonstrations of elements of the Ritual.

Access details are on the new Provincial business cards and are currently being promoted via Provincial Officer's email addresses. Secretaries and Scribe E's are encouraged to add the site details to their Summons including the QR code. Members create their own login/password details for access to Solomon. Mentors should try and encourage structured reading with newer members of the Lodge / Chapter, links to Solomon can also be found in the new Provincial Vault.

W. Bro Molley also explained that part of the ongoing Property Initiative, a new Province-wide Wi-Fi is being investigated to enable the majority of the Masonic Centres across the Province to have super-fast broadband to enable easier use of these various web-based initiatives from tablets, smart phones and laptops at the Masonic Centres. There will be one log-in that will provide Wi-Fi across the Province.

The presentation by W. Bro Ralph Howarth, ProvGAlm illustrated the extent of the work being undertaken by the Provincial Almoner's team of volunteers. In 2018/19 the MCF were able to direct more than £170,000 into the Province for use by Brethren / Companions and their families who were suffering some level of financial distress. The team of volunteers operate directly with the Lodge / Chapter Almoner to relieve him from the administration once a need is identified within the Province. There is then continuous liaison with that Almoner and the direct dependents of the member in distress or the member himself if it is one of his dependents requiring that need. Information on this is also available via the new Provincial Vault website.

R. W. Bro John Lockley brought the afternoon to a close by thanking the Presentation team and the Brethren/Companions who had attended and clearly taken notice of a great deal of the content based on the interesting questions that had arisen at the end of the day. Also highlighting how the new Provincial Vault will be the way forward for the Province and encouraging members across the Province to engage with it and offer constructive feedback via the site if there are elements not yet covered.


