

Together we can win the war against covid-19. I trust that you will all take care and stay safe.

In Knights Templar he is a past Eminent Preceptor of Godefroi de Bouillon Preceptory and has been an active member of the Prov Priors Body Guard becoming its Commander in 2016. Promoted to Prov Marshall in 2019 he is active throughout the Province.

Having served for 25 years in the Army Ralph became a Teacher, he is currently working part time and trying to retire! Ralph has a BA (Hon's) degree in Education. Is a Fellow of the Society for Education and Training, a Chartered Member of the Institute of Logistics and

Tariq came to England in 1966 and in 1968 joined the Birmingham City Police becoming the very first officer from the South Asian community to be enrolled. He completed his 30 years service mostly as a Detective officer based in Handsworth, Birmingham but was often seconded to other Divisions and Forces across the country to assist in major crimes, mostly murders! During his career he was involved in nearly 40 murder enquiries.

Tariq is a very proficient Cricketer and has played the sport at a high level having played in the Birmingham League. He Captained the West Midlands Police for a number of years and has also played for Warwickshire Over 50's and Over 60's in a National competition. Despite his advancing age he still plays regularly for the West

Midlands Police Veterans.

Tariq is married to Zarin and is the father of 2 boys and grandfather of 3. His hobbies include reading, travelling, gardening and sport.

On the 3rd of March 1994 Tariq was initiated into the Lodge of St. Matthew No. 539 and became its Master in 2005 and again in 2006. In 2007 he was appointed Provincial Grand Steward and joined the Provincial Grand Stewards Lodge No.9567 and was installed as its Master in 2017. In 2018 he was promoted to Past Provincial Grand Sword Bearer.

"It's okay not to be okay"



How many times have you felt down, low, depressed? It happens to all of us at some time in our lives - yet how many of us actually admit that

there is something wrong?

We're all guilty of keeping things bottled up - it's the "manly" thing to do.....or is it?

Depression and anxiety are very real and seem to carry a stigma for anyone that suffers with them, when in reality these conditions are no different to other illnesses and conditions. The symptoms are very real and have a huge impact on those who are suffering, their families and friends.

So, what can you do about this? Well, for a start you aren't on your own. Many people suffer in silence, but you don't have to

There are various issues in life that can cause our mood to go down, to feel anxious and depressed. Debt, bereavement, illness or trauma, divorce, the list goes on.

Help is available in all of these situations from the MCF via the confidential counselling careline. No paperwork is needed, just by taking the first step in calling the MCF will help you on the road to recovery.

Life has its ups and downs and there are times that we need to speak to someone else outside of our family, or friends, to address the situation and this is where the MCF can help.

Just a simple call the team on **0800 035 6090** will get you that help from a trained counsellor.

It doesn't end there - if the counsellor feels that you need further specialist

clinical intervention (such as CBT, or other specialist support) then they will recommend that to the MCF who will then request a visiting volunteer, or member of the Advice and Support Team to come and see you to help in completing a formal application.

Just remember, you aren't on your own and there is someone available to talk to who will not make any judgements.

The PGM's challenge this year is Go-Karting to be set sometime in June. This is to be part of a fun day and open to all, hopefully with numerous teams taking part, including we hope a ladies' team. The PGM, coming from a motoring background, is looking for revenge!

The Province has held a Provincial raffle for a Porsche experience day for two brethren and this has raised in excess of £2500 for the Festival. Other recent Festival fund raisers have included a Port bottle raffle and a Burns night at the County Show Ground. My thanks to ALL those who helped make these a success.

However, again I must emphasise how vital it is that we get as many RPPs (Direct Debits) completed in favour of the Festival as soon as we can as this method of collection of donations has been shown by all leading charities to be the most successful. By signing up now, for as little as the price of a cup of coffee a week, a brother, even the most "Hard up", can easily reach the qualifying level of Festival Steward and the Province can reach its target.

We shall be having the Air Ambulance Helicopter pod and the blood bikes at the Staffordshire County Show along with our new display trailer. Last year was our best show in terms of 'Footfall' and interest taken in our Masonic Charitable Giving. At last Freemasonry is getting itself known to be a force for good and not a society of 'Satanic followers'.

Did you know that the MCF offers access to the Counselling Careline for anyone struggling to cope? The Counselling Careline is a free and confidential support service operated by trained counsellors who will listen

to you, offer professional guidance and can arrange additional telephone or face-to-face sessions. This is a free service and requires no form filling or application. It is totally confidential and does not involve either Lodge or Provincial Almoners. Simply call the MCF on 0800 035 60 90 (calls are free).

We now have "Teddies" in ambulances operating from Stoke and hopefully these will shortly be carried in Fire Engines, thanks to the efforts by Mike Vozza who is revitalizing the scheme in the Province. The new teddies have padded feet where a child can personalise their Teddy by writing a name on the enlarged foot pad.

Following the success of the Prostate Screening last year we have managed to get Jyoti Shah, the Consultant Urological Surgeon and her team to come to Wolverhampton on Friday August 7th 2020 for another day of Prostate Screening. This is to enable those who missed last year to be tested. You must be between 50 and 80 years old on the test day to qualify and not had the screening last year. Last year the number of "Positives" was fortunately below the national average, but you must not be complacent, Get

tested, it could be YOU!

We are also organising a screening day at the Hanley Masonic Centre in Shelton on 5th May 2020 to detect "Abdominal Aortic Aneurysms" for men aged 65 plus. These aneurysms are only found in men and are symptomless. Many of you will have already had this NHS test but it appears that some may have missed out for whatever reason, which includes me! The test is non-invasive and takes only a few minutes with an ultra-sound detector and the results are immediate.

However, should an AAA rupture (a bit like a bulge on a bike tyre) death is immediate! Detection can mean that the defect can be relatively easily fixed. Having been 'Missed' myself and recently had a family member die through a ruptured aneurysm, totally out of the blue, I shall be at Shelton Masonic Hall on Tuesday May 5th for my test. Please book for both Screenings through Marianne, Charity Office Manager, at the Provincial Office on 01902 745151. When booking, please have your 10 digit NHS number to hand as it will be required to secure the booking.



Very Illustrious Knight David J Leigh, Past Grand High Chancellor

The St Chad Conclave No 320 of the Order of The Red Cross of Constantine

recently celebrated a very special occasion. In recognition of his long and dedicated service to the Order, their Marshal, Very Illustrious Knight David J Leigh, Past Grand High Chancellor, was presented with a 'Diploma of Merit' by the Intendant-General for the West Midlands Division, Rt III Kt John J Tristram.

The Intendant-General gave a brief summary of David's history in the Order of the Red Cross of Constantine. He was Installed as a Knight-Companion in Saye & Sele Conclave No 122 London in December 1975, and was Enthroned as Most Puissant Sovereign in that Conclave in 1989. David remains a member of that Conclave and is their current Marshal. He was also a Founder member of the Guild of Freeman Conclave No 483 and is currently their Recorder, an office he has held for 9 years.

David was a Founder member of St Chad Conclave, Stafford in 1977 and became Most Puissant Sovereign in 2014. He was appointed to Grand Rank in 1988 and has received a number of Grand Rank promotions in recognition of his service, eventually becoming a Very Illustrious Knight on his appointment to the rank of Past Grand High Almoner in 1999. In 2013 David received a further promotion, to Past Grand High Almoner, the rank which he holds today.

The Intendant-General said that David's support for the Conclaves in Staffordshire and his dedicated service to the Order deserved to be acknowledge and rewarded and he was delighted to present David with his Diploma of Merit, the first to be presented in the West Midlands Division.

The Pro Grand Master clarified that it was the wish of the Grand Master that as the OSM is an acknowledgement of exceptional service to Freemasonry and is the highest honour the Grand Master can confer on any member it should be worn not only at craft meetings but also those relating to the Royal Arch degree.

The Order is a neck decoration in the form of a Garter blue ribbon from which hangs the jewel of the Order. The jewel is of silver-gilt, being a double-circle with a pair of compasses extended on the segment of a circle, and the letters O S M; beneath it is the motto In Solo Deo Salus "In God alone is our safety".

A New Venture for the PrGM

Falcon Lodge No: 1416





Why I became a Mason

Shaun's Story:

My name is Shaun Michael Galloway and I have been a Freemason for 19 years. I am originally from Penticton, B.C., Canada. However, I have spent the past 28 years living, working, training completing my Masters degree in Budapest, Hungary and I was exposed to Masonry through my studies and pastimes. I later read an article in a Hungarian newspaper for English readers, that there was to be an English speaking Lodge formed in Budapest. I was working in Kuwait at the time so I

> had to wait until we completed our contract before my wife, newborn son and I moved back to Budapest. On our return I duly applied and joined St Stephens Lodge No: 7 of Symbolic Lodge of Hungary in 2003.

The Lodge was originally consecrated in 1864 as Hungary's first Budapest Lodge and operated in German, it has a long and very interesting history. In the 1920's there were a number Lodges in Hungary with over 10,000 members but this dwindled to less than 300 and by 1950 following the Communist takeover, the Grand Lodge was forcibly dissolved. However, following the fall of Communism Freemasonry flourished again. The Lodge was reborn and re-consecrated in 1999 to work in English and

uses a form of old Emulation ritual. This was the same year The Grand Lodge celebrated 250 years of masonry in Hungary. Its membership is drawn from both the Hungarian and expatriate

community in Budapest although it does boast a large international membership.

W. Bro Mark Walton, the Dept Grandmaster and past member of Etheldreda Lodge No: 2107 (UGLE) was one of the first people I met, he conducted the traditional interview and taught me more of the history of masonry as well as the history of Hungarian masonry in particular. I completed my PhD (Certified Psychologist and Psychophysiology of Sport) and was raised to a MM in 2005. I moved back to Canada for a year and then relocated to the Midlands and a new job at the University of Wolverhampton.

During that time I would visit my father in Athens, Greece and on one occasion we were having dinner together when he said something during the meal that made me think. I was curious and asked if he was a Mason and to my astonishment he was, neither of us knew the other had joined. He had joined St. Georges Lodge No: 52, an English speaking Lodge in Athens of the National Grand Lodge of Greece only a year after I had joined St. Stephens!

I often think about what drew my attention to masonry, I believe that it is the attention to detail and the way that the order and membership conduct themselves. I love the antiquity of the order; the manners; the pomp and circumstance but at the same time the kindness and brotherly love. I have been training in traditional Japanese karate for 38 years and precision, etiquette and symbolism are part of who I am - and I find that in Masonry to. The Japanese have a focus on consideration for others called "Omoiyari" (おもいや り). This compassion, consideration and empathy for others are also clearly a part of masonry and sadly something that society is sometimes sorely missina.

Having settled in the UK I visited and eventually joined Aldridge Lodge No: 7921 with the assistance of W. Bro Place, the secretary who helped me to deal with the intricacies of membership and joining. I have since joined Vernon Royal Arch Chapter No: 539, Croft Mark Lodge No: 1524 and Bernard de Tremelay Preceptory No: 170 of Knights Templar. I look forward to many more happy and enjoyable years in masonry and if my wife permits - the ability to join a few more orders!
